The session was dedicated to fostering student-teacher interactions, allowing students to express their feelings and appreciation for their teachers. This created an emotional bond between students and teachers.

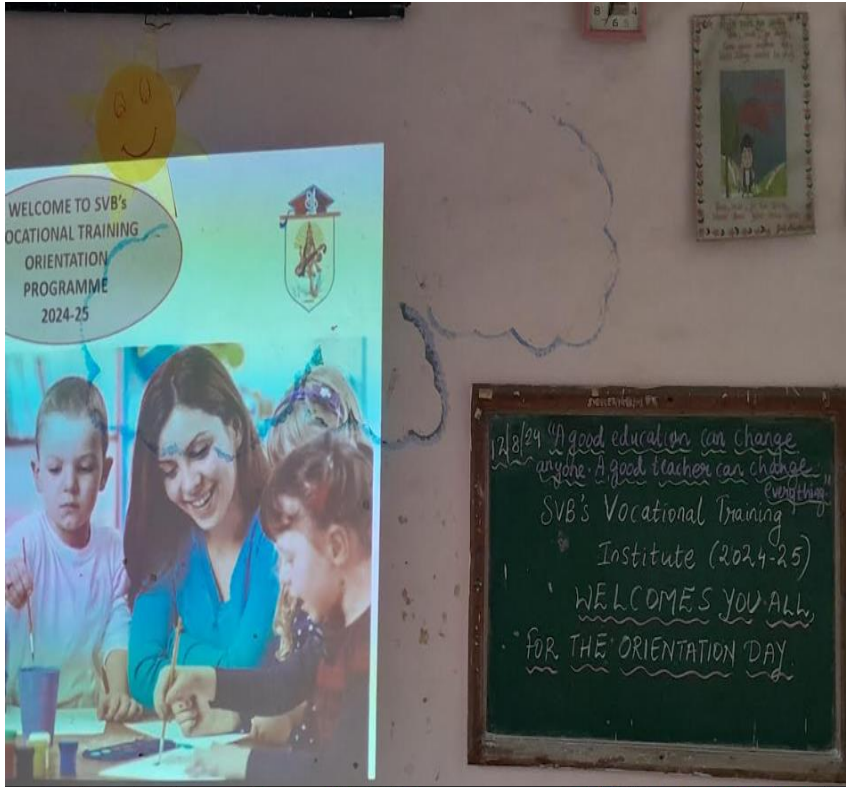
The purpose of this orientation was to equip student teachers and staff with essential knowledge and skills related to early childhood care and education. The session included:
